HISTORY OF SAINT MARY'S COLLEGE

Founded in 1863 by the Roman Catholic
Archdiocese of San Francisco, Saint Mary's
College of California is one of the oldest
colleges in the West. The College campus
originally was located in San Francisco, and
operated for several years under Archdiocesan
direction.

Archbishop of San Francisco Joseph Alemany, who was unhappy with the College's operation under the diocesan clergy, appealed to Pope Pius IX in 1867 for assistance in persuading the Superior General of the Christian Brothers to send Brothers to assume direction of the College. Nine Brothers arrived in San Francisco in 1868. Within two years, the student body increased from 50 to 200. The first Bachelor's degrees were awarded in 1872.

In 1889, the campus was moved to Oakland's
Brickpile facility, where the College operated
until 1928, when it moved to Moraga. The
original Moraga campus was much smaller than
the current campus. Eleven of the original
buildings, constructed during 1928-1929, are still
in use today. They include the Chapel, Dante
and Galileo Halls.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS & REQUIREMENTS

To study abroad at Saint Mary's, students will be required to have a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.8 on 4.0 scale and a TOEFL iBT score of 80. Students or their sponsors must submit applications, deposits and application fees to SMC by the deadline date. All other fees are paid upon arrival to campus.

Course Enrollment and Orientation

Students enroll in 4 courses on a space-available basis. Once you are accepted, you will submit a list of courses that you are interested in taking and the Registrar's Office will create a course schedule for you. All study abroad students are required to attend the mandatory Exchange Student Orientation.

Housing

On-campus housing options include dormitory-style single or double rooms in either a townhouse or residence hall. Fees are variable depending on student choice and options that are open at the time of arrival. Estimated monthly room and board is based on a double room in a residence hall.

Student Services
